	1 piece must have a 140–150 cm warp width
	6 pieces must have linen warp
	2 pieces must have single ply linen warp (can be part of the 6 above)
	All pieces must be finished items (un-sewn fabric OK, washed and pressed)
	2 rugs are to be included
	Display will include your binder of completed project sheets (giving credit to
	appropriate sources).
